Scott . He acted in more than 40 stage productions and is a member of Screen Actors Guild and Actors Equity. Patrick had a 600 seat legitimate theater, where he produced and directed over 120 plays musicals, events and concerts including directing Oscar winners Virginia Mayo in "Butterflies are Free" and JK Simmons in "The Fantastiks", working further with Mr. Simmons to direct his production of "Godspell". . Patrick produced and directed "Broadway Cabaret" for Sundance Cruise line the 1200 passenger ship He has produced and directed the "Stardancer" opening ceremonies of the WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS OF PERFORMING ARTS (WCOPA) for 17 years and has directed the final night world wide web performance for 19 years. The WCOPA international competition hosts over 40 countries that compete in Olympic style for the "gold" in singing, dancing, acting and variety performances.

Patrick and his wife, Bonnie, are currently the owners of a small SAG franchised theatrical agency in Los Angeles. Bonnie is a registered dietitian and will ensure that the snacks provided are "healthy"!

Film & New Media

How To Make A Movie: Students will learn how to make a high quality movie or short film through the use of modern technology such as IPhones.

Marketing In New Media: Students will learn how to strategize and target their key audiences through various forms of social media such as YouTube.

Acting For The Camera: Students will learn the basic techniques of Acting for the camera.

How To Make A Demo Reel: Students will learn how to build, create and film their own Demo Reel for film acting.

Film Terminology: Students will learn the in's & out's of film ethics, protocols and basic film terminology.

<u>*Take Home</u>: Each student will be provided with a personal USB Drive or DVD featuring all of the content they are involved in. Including but not limited to: Demo Reels, Monologues and Personal Film Projects.

Puppetry: Students will learn how to design, build and operate your own puppet.

How To Audition: Students will learn how and what to prepare for an audition (Musical or Straight Play), and how hold themselves in a professional atmosphere.

Comedy Acting For The Stage: Students will be learn through various on stage techniques beginning with Pantomime and ending with learning how to analyze, dissect and execute a comedic scene or monologue for live theatre. **Theatre Terminology**: Students will learn the in's & out's of theatre ethics, protocols and basic theatre terminology.

Musical Theatre: Students will learn the various forms of Musical Theatre including Dance (Jazz & Modern), Singing and various performance techniques surrounding this specific art form.

<u>*Take Home</u>: A final showcase performance featuring all of our students and highlighting the areas in which they have studied.
